Onga River (Class A River)

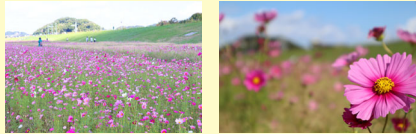
The only river that salmon run in Kyushu.
The length of the river: 61km



Cosmos Fields in Mizumaki

In Autumn (late October-early November), you can see over 5 million cosmos flowers along the riverbed of Onga River. The "Mizumaki Cosmos Festival" is held in the park near the fields every year.

By car: about 10 min. from Mizumaki Sta.
On foot: about 40 min. from Mizumaki Sta.

You can buy a variety of specialty products of Mizumaki and other North Kyushu areas. In Mizumaki, we have "Deka-Ninniku (or Big-Garlic)" products.

By car: about 9min. from Mizumaki Sta.
On foot: about 35min. from Mizumaki Sta.



Yatsurugi Shrine

One of Japan's biggest ginkgo trees is in this shrine. This 1900-year-old tree has a trunk circumference of approx. 9.7m, and has been designated as a natural monument of Fukuoka prefecture. The ginkgo tree is also designated as Mizumaki's town tree.

By car: about 5 min. from Mizumaki Sta.
On foot: about 25 min. from Mizumaki Sta.

Jujika-no Tou (Cross Monument)

A Memorial cenotaph for foreign prisoners of war built after World War II. It is now Mizumaki's symbol of peace. Relationships between Mizumaki and the Netherlands started through this cenotaph.
